HOA MAKES CLUBHOUSE IMPROVEMENTS

The Fenwick Clubhouse is available for residents to host private parties and events.

Residents Daniel and Alyssa Syring accepted the role of clubhouse managers in January this year. Daniel's vast technology knowledge helped bring about some new improvements.

A keyless entry system has been installed on the clubhouse front door, so party hosts don't have to worry about losing or returning a physical key. Each renter receives a new entry code that works



only during the time period for which they need access. Wifi access is available and sound-absorbing acoustic panels were installed in August to lessen crowd noise during large get-togethers.

So now is a great time to rent the clubhouse for your own family gathering or party with friends. It's available for residents' private events at a cost of \$75 on weekdays and \$100 per day on weekends. If you're hosting a single event for Fenwick residents only, there's no rental fee. MAINTENANCE COMMITTEE: KEEPING FENWICK BEAUTIFUL AND SAFE

Much of the HOA's work goes on behind the scenes, but some of it happens right outside your front door! Here is a brief list of what the Fenwick HOA maintenance committee has accomplished in 2018.

- Maintain park areas: mow, fertilize, seed as required
- Maintain neighborhood . entrances
- **Remove dead trees**
- Creek area cleanup, clean out . brush, raise canopy along sidewalks
- Maintain ponds: keep fountains in good repair, remove excess turtles, remove beavers, keep out excess water plants
- Treat area trees and shrubs as needed

- **Repair brick wall along** Pennsylvania Avenue
- Update signage in park areas
- Playground inspection and repair; add mulch
- Maintain sprinkler system
- Spray for poison ivy in creek • area
- West pond culvert replaced
- **Repair water well along Western**
- Creek erosion repair in one area: installation of Flexamat and a retaining wall

READY TO MAKE SOME EXTERIOR CHANGES TO YOUR HOME? CONTACT THE ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE FIRST!

Just a friendly reminder that our neighborhood covenants specify that before you make any changes to the exterior of your home--such as painting any new colors, adding a deck or pergola or door, paving a piece of your driveway, etc--you MUST receive approval from the HOA Architectural Committee. If you do not receive approval, you could be required to undo the changes, and/or pay a fine of \$1,000.

If you are simply touching up exterior paint or repainting the same as your existing color, or repairing an existing structure, you do not need approval. Fenwick is a desirable neighborhood that maintains its property values in part because our rules require us to maintain the aesthetic beauty and homogeneity of our homes.

On our website you can read Fenwick's design guidelines, and access the Architectural Review Committee application. (NOTE: Fenwick Garden Village may have its own requirements in addition to these).



The good news is that you can still feed them, you just need to ensure that you are feeding them the right things. Cut Seedless Grapes, Cooked Rice, Birdseed, Peas, Corn, Oats and Chopped Lettuce are all great choices.



TURTLE TRAPS ARE NOT TOYS! POND ECOSYSTEM CONTROL



The Fenwick HOA consistently monitors and manages the health of our ponds and the creatures who make them their home.

In recent years, our ponds have become overrun with turtles. These turtles, in such great numbers, unbalance the ecosystem of our ponds, eating fish and creating waste. If we do not manage our turtle population, our ponds will have to be dredged more frequently and we will have fewer fish for neighborhood fishing.

The turtles are humanely captured and relocated. PLEASE do not remove, play with, move, open or interfere with turtle traps in any way.

SECRETS TO WEED CONTROL

Promote a healthy root system.

Healthy plants with strong roots naturally fight weeds by absorbing the water and nutrients your plants need to flourish. Mowing your grass on a higher setting allows the grass to crowd out many weeds.

Prevent winter weed growth.

The cooler months are an ideal time for winter weed growth because your lawn goes into a dormant state. You can prevent this winter weed growth by applying preemergent treatments in the fall before the cooler temperatures arrive.

Ensure proper lawn watering.

Improper watering can cause a variety of issues, including weed growth. Plants like dollar weed thrive in over-watered lawns.
